Summary of Position

The role of an Activity Leader is to ensure the welfare and safety of the children on our summer residential camp and to deliver outstanding, structured activities.

Whilst the camp is residential, this role is during daytime hours only, with staff commuting daily.

Using supporting resources, you will be expected to deliver a mixture of structured sports, arts, tech and crafts activities and games to children aged between 8 and 12 years, with an emphasis on participation, care, and development.

As well as leading sessions, staff contribute to the high standard of physical, emotional, and social care offered by Ultimate Summer Residential. Our Activity Leaders have a pastoral role as the leader of a group of children on camp, with the focus being on maintaining welfare and providing high quality care.

Duties and Responsibilities

With full training provided:

- Prepare and deliver activities for children aged between 8-12, focusing on participation, development and enjoyment, working both alone and alongside other staff.
- Take a pastoral role as a group leader, welcoming new children into your group and liaising with the Camp Central Manager.
- Supervise and engage with the children outside of activity times.
- Continuously promote the welfare of the children in your care.
- Show high levels of energy, enthusiasm and professionalism, acting as a suitable role model for the children.
- Ensure all policies and procedures on camp are adhered to by yourself and the children in your care, including all health and safety, and safeguarding procedures.
- Live up to the Ultimate Summer Residential motto of '*A Summer of Fun. A Lifetime of Memories*', behaving in a manner that reflects the expectations of the company throughout your employment.
- Other ad-hoc duties (e.g., cleaning, equipment maintenance etc).

Essential Requirements

- Experience of working with children and delivering activities.
- Able to tailor delivery and structure of a session according to age and ability.
- Be enthusiastic, energetic and passionate about developing children through play and activity.
- Good organisation and communication skills. Candidates must be confident in their ability to lead a group of children and not shy away from responsibility.
- A flexible team player, able to adapt to dynamic situations and challenges on camp.
- Someone looking for a challenging but hugely rewarding and enjoyable job in the holidays, looking to further their career in the childcare and coaching industry.

Desirable Requirements

- Qualified in or working towards a relevant sport, art technologist, performing arts, teaching or childcare qualification.
- Experience taking sole charge of a group of children.
- Hold a Paediatric First Aid qualification.
